### WHEN WAS THE LAST TIME YOU READ TO YOUR CHILD?

### **Reading to Young Children: A Head-Start in Life**

Did you know... Melbourne University explored the connections between parents reading to their young children and their child's


later reading and other cognitive skills. \*This research was a result of a partnership arrangement between the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development and the Melbourne Institute of Applied Economic and Social Research.



### The key findings included:

The frequency of reading to children at a young age has a direct causal effect on their schooling outcomes regardless of their family background and home environment.

- ✓ Reading to children at age 4-5 every day has a significant positive effect on their reading skills and cognitive skills (that is, language and literacy, numeracy and cognition) later in life.
  - Reading to children 3-5 days per week (compared to 2 or less) has the same effect on the child's reading skills at age 4-5 as being six months older.
  - Reading to them 6-7 days per week has the same effect as being almost 12 months older.
- ✓ Children read to more frequently at age 4-5 achieve higher scores on the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests for both Reading and Numeracy in Year 3 (age 8 to 9).
- ✓ These differences in reading and cognitive skills are not related to the child's family background or home environment but are the direct result of how frequently they have been read to prior to starting school.

### PARENT TEACHER MEETING TIPS

Parent-teacher meeting are an opportunity for you to meet and get to know your child's teacher and foster a positive and respectful relationship with our school. They are an opportunity to share information about your child's progress, interests and needs and discuss your child's learning with their teacher.

They provide valuable opportunities to help the teacher understand more about your child. By asking questions and finding out more about the information on your child's report you have an opportunity to become further involved in your child's learning and give support where needed.

#### Before the conference

- ✓ Please read through your child's report (found on Compass) and work out which specific areas you have questions about.
- ✓ Ask your child if there are any questions they would like you to ask or if there is anything they would like you to tell the teacher.
- ✓ Ask your child what they think the teacher is going to tell you.
- ✓ Write a list of questions you want to ask your child's teacher and take notes during the conference so you can share the comments with your child or other members of the family.
- ✓ Think about any information you will need to let the teacher know e.g. changes that have had an impact on your child, you and your child's goals for learning.
- ✓ If you need a translator ask the school to help organise this before the conference.

### **During the conference**

- ✓ If you want to know about a specific area of your child's progress let your child's teacher know this at the start so you can focus the conference on this topic.
- ✓ Ask for more information on what is expected for homework. Find out how much time your child should be spending on their homework and ask for suggestions on how you can help your child at home.
- ✓ Find out more about how your child is enjoying school and taking part in class activities and whether there are any general issues with behaviour that need to be discussed.
- ✓ Ask your child's teacher to explain any extra support or extension activities mentioned in the report.
- ✓ Share with the teacher any information you consider important for them to develop a deeper understanding of your child.

#### After the conference

- ✓ Keep in regular contact with the teacher to follow up on your agreed plan.
- ✓ Talk with your child about what you discussed with their teacher and how you can work together to improve their learning.
- ✓ <u>You can also request conferences at other times</u>. If you are concerned about your child's progress, call the Office to make an appointment to meet with your child's classroom teacher.

# BENEFITS OF READING to your Child

Parents play an integral part in their children's education and helping them reach their full potential. Here are some benefits of reading to your children:

#### Helps them sleep.

Getting a good night's rest is important for developing children, and reading to them while they are in bed can calm their their minds and bodies.

#### Improves communication skills.

When you spend time reading to children, they will be much more likely to express themselves and relate to others in a healthy way.

#### Creates new bonds.

With a majority of our days spent looking at computer, TV and phone screens, it's important to take a few moments to spend quality time with your children. Reading to your children also can build an emotional connection. It's a win-win.



### Teaches them the basics.

Teaching children to read is like building a house — you need to have a solid foundation that you can build upon later in life.

### Improves logical thinking skills.

Reading to children helps their ability to grasp abstract concepts, apply logic, recognize cause and effect, and use good judgment.

### Hi everyone!

### "There is no health without mental health" - World Health Organisation

Mental health difficulties affect 1 in 7 Australian children. These difficulties can lead to behavioural and emotional problems, which provide a challenge for the child as well as the child's parents and their school.

Signs that a child is experiencing mental health issues could include:

- Anxious behaviour including a lot of worrying
- A constant negative mindset
- Withdrawn behaviour
- Aggressive behaviour
- Being hyperactive and not able to pay attention

Often it's particularly stressful for parents as they don't know where to get help.

### Did you know?

We are lucky at Thomastown West Primary School to have child psychologist Jordan Hassed from an organisation called Nirodah (see <a href="www.nirodah.com">www.nirodah.com</a>) available to help.

Jordan visits us on a weekly basis to provide counselling and extra support to students. With a GP referral, there is no cost for this service.

Next week's newsletter will feature a "Meet Jordan" section where I ask Jordan questions about herself and the counselling service. In the meantime, if you believe your child could benefit from this service please call me for a confidential discussion.
