From the Principal

We are swiftly approaching the end of term four and the conclusion of the 2023 school year. Specifically, there are only 17.5 school days remaining until the summer holidays begin. PRIMARY SCHOOL PROGRAMS

- > At 8:30am the double gates at the front entrance of our school will be opened for students to enter.


