

Did you know that the Department of Education currently has a targeted focus on student attendance?

#### As of Friday last week, we have:

28 students who have attended school every day.

10.4% students who have missed up to 10 days of school this year.

15.6% students who have missed between 10 - 20 days of school this year.

25% of students arrive late to school each day.

#### Let's work together to turn this around – having your child/ren at school is important to us.

Daily school attendance is important for all children and young people to succeed in education and to ensure they don't fall behind both socially and developmentally. Children and young people who regularly attend school and complete Year 12 or an equivalent qualification have better health outcomes, better employment outcomes, and higher incomes across their lives. It is important that children develop habits of regular attendance at an early age.

While PRIME produce two versions of the drink Hydration (which contains no caffeine) and Energy (which does contains caffeine and is only available online in Australia) the hydration version is still not suit- able to bring to school.






#### **Buddies**

#### Thomastown West Mobile Phones Policy 2022 - 2026

Thomastown West Primary School is committed to providing a safe, secure and stimulating learning environment for all students. We understand that students reach their full potential only when they are happy, healthy and safe, and that a positive school culture helps to engage students and support them in their learning. Our school acknowledges that student wellbeing and student learning outcomes are closely linked.

#### **PURPOSE**

To explain to our school community, the Department of Education's and Thomastown West Primary School's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones during school hours.

#### SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students at Thomastown West Primary and,
- Students' personal mobile phones and smart watches (brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime).

#### **DEFINITIONS**

For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to mobile phones and any device (e.g. smart watches), that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone (such as communication including messaging and/or photography or video capability), including devices with Wi-Fi, Bluetooth or sim card.

#### POLICY

Thomastown West Primary School understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At Thomastown West Primary School:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored in the school office during school hours
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

#### Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's Mobile Phones Policy issued by the Minister for Education, <a href="https://www.education.vic.gov.au/school/principals/spag/safety/Pages/mobilephones.aspx">https://www.education.vic.gov.au/school/principals/spag/safety/Pages/mobilephones.aspx</a> personal mobile phones must not be used at Thomastown West Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

#### Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Thomastown West Primary school are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Thomastown West Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the Thomastown West Primary School's Personal Property Policy AND/OR the Department's Personal Goods policy:

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Thomastown West Primary school will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Thomastown West Primary school students are required to store their phones at the front office in a lockable cupboard for the duration of the day. At 3:15pm, students will be able to access their phones from the front office.

#### Enforcement

If found to have a mobile phone, Thomastown West Primary School staff will instruct the student to hand over the item(s) and if the student refuses to hand over the items, implement the relevant disciplinary provision within the schools School Wide Positive Behaviour procedures and Student Engagement, Wellbeing and Inclusion Policy.

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Thomastown West Primary school may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's Student Wellbeing, Engagement and Inclusion Policy.

At Thomastown West Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones is **any use during school hours** (including school evening events eg. Kaboom Sports, concerts, camps, excursions and while on school grounds before and after school), unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- · in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images at school, such as in the school toilets or during classroom assessments
- to capture video or images at an excursion, for example at swimming pools, gym or change rooms.

Before students bring their personal mobile phone to school, Thomastown West Primary School requires students to complete the *Student Personal Mobile Phone at School Agreement* (refer to APPENDIX) and return the agreement to school, signed by their parents or carers.

#### Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
  - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions (such as a student with diabetes may use their mobile phone to monitor their blood sugar); and
  - Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's Mobile Phones Policy.



#### Thomastown West Mobile Phones Policy 2022 - 2026

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's Mobile Phones Policy are:

#### 1. Learning-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
For specific learning activities (class-based exception)	Unit of work, learning sequence
For students for whom a reasonable adjustment to a learning program is needed because of a disability or learning difficulty	Individual Learning Plan, Individual Education Plan

#### 2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation	
Students with a health condition	Student Health Support Plan	
Students who are Young Carers	A localised student record	

#### 3. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

Specific exception	Documentation
Travelling to and from excursions	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students on excursions and camps	Risk assessment planning documentation
When students are offsite (not on school grounds) and unsupervised with parental permission	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students with a dual enrolment or who need to undertake intercampus travel	Risk assessment planning documentation

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

#### Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Thomastown West Primary School will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can or cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones. The enforcement of inappropriate access and use of mobile phones on camps, excursions and extracurricular activities is as described in the enforcement section of this policy.

#### Exclusions

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-School-Hours Care (OSHC)
- Travelling to and from school

Thomastown West Primary School is pleased to announce that we are now a SunSmart School.

The SunSmart program is dedicated to reducing skin cancer incidence, illness and mortality through a targeted prevention and early detection program.

The objectives of the SunSmart Program is:

- Improve and monitor skin cancer prevention awareness, knowledge, attitudes and behaviour
- 2. Support priority populations to detect cancers earlier.
- Advocate for strategies that aim to reduce the health and economic burdens of skin cancer.

Thomastown West Primary School recommends that from September 1<sup>st</sup> to end of April, and whenever UV levels reach 3 and above, students come to school wearing sunprotective clothing such as:

- loose, cool, closely-woven fabric
- shirts with a collar and/or high necklines
- tops with elbow length or long sleeves
- longer style shorts and skirts
- a wide brim hat/ bucket or legionnaire style hat to be worn in September 1<sup>st</sup> to the end of April.

For the best protection use all five forms of sun protection-clothing, sunscreen, a broad brim hat, shade and sunglasses-when the UV is 3 and above.



Looking for a new way to serve up your food? Try a lettuce cup! Children will love filling a crisp lettuce leaf with delicious fried rice and eating straight from their hands. This is a great way to empty your fridge and use up any leftover rice and vegetables.

#### **EQUIPMENT:**

- Measuring cup and spoons
- Chopping board
- Cook's knife
- Small bowl
- Whisk or fork
- ➤ Wok

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 6 eggs
- 3 tsp salt-reduced soy sauce
- 2 cm knob of ginger peeled and finely chopped
- 2 tsp sunflower oil
- 4 cups cooked rice
- 1 bunch spring onions, finely chopped
- 2 silverbeet leaves, finely chopped
- 1 small red onion, peeled and finely chopped
- ➤ 1 small carrot, finely chopped or grated
- 30 small whole lettuce leaves

#### WHAT TO DO:

- 1. Beat the eggs in the small bowl with the ginger.
- 2. Heat the wok with 1 tsp sunflower oil.
- 3. Pour in the egg mixture and leave to cook for 20 seconds, before folding onto itself and cooking through.
- 4. Remove the egg from the wok and allow it to cool on the chopping board, then slice it thinly.
- 5. Heat the remaining sunflower oil in the wok.
- 6. Add the onion, ginger, carrot and spring onions and cook for 2 minutes, then add the rice and soy sauce.


