### **Teacher Replacements**

Teacher absence from school is unavoidable and can sometimes be unpredictable. Where possible, the school will provide the best replacement learning opportunities whenever staff are absent, despite the frequent difficulties of locating appropriate casual relief teachers.

At all times, our school aims to provide a consistent approach to curriculum delivery, so that all students access equal learning opportunities.

For this reason, if a replacement teacher cannot be provided, the school may use a variety of ways to ensure students still access quality learning programs and their educational needs are met during teacher absence. These include:

- Using a variety of teachers (including Leadership, tutors etc) throughout the day who may have a spare teaching session to teach the class.

- Cancelling a Specialist class (if this does not affect the quarantined planning time for teachers) to cover the class.
- Splitting the class between the same/similar year level where the students can join in the work of that class.

### Mrs Young's Games Corner: UNO A Classic Game with Fun New Versions!

**UNO** has been a popular card game for years, loved by students, teachers and families

because it's easy to learn and super fun to play. But did you know there are lots of different versions of UNO that make the game even more exciting?

In UNO Flip, the regular deck has a "Flip" side with new action cards and tougher penalties. Just when you think you're winning, someone might play a Flip card, and the game changes completely!

If you like a serious challenge and *my personal favourite*, **UNO No Mercy** is perfect for you. This version is all about tough competition, with more intense action cards that make it even harder to win. It's called "No Mercy" for a reason—only the last player standing wins! I love the 7 and 0 rule. This can be played with a standard deck of UNO cards. When you play a 7 (other normal rules apply) swap cards with a person of your choice. Play a 0 card, and everyone passes their cards to the person to their left or right, depending on the direction the game is currently being played.

For those who like things to be a bit wild, **UNO All Wild** has every card as a wild card, making the game fast and unpredictable.

These different versions of UNO bring something new to the table, whether you like a tough challenge, a quick game, or a themed adventure. Why not try one of these versions at your next family game night? You might find a new favourite way to play!

- > Breakfast Club will open at 7:45am.
- > Breakfast Club is FREE.
- Breakfast Club will operate from our Thomastown West Community Hub.
- Students will enter Breakfast Club via the single Hub gate on Main Street.
- > From 7:45am 8:15am parents or carers must drop their child at Breakfast Club and sign them in.
- > From 8:15am students may arrive at Breakfast Club in the Hub and sign in without their parents or carers.
- > Students are encouraged to bring a small toy or game to play. There are plenty of books to read at the Hub.
- > The Breakfast Club will close at 8:30am and the single Hub gate on Main Street will be closed.
- At 8:30am the double gates at the front entrance of our school will be opened for students to enter.



## It's NOT OK to BE AWAY UNLESS YOU ARE SICK!

Please support our school community by keeping your children at home while they are unwell. The table below indicates the duration of your child's recovery period and the period during which they should refrain from attending school while infectious.

Chicken Pox	Until fully recovered. Please note some remaining scabs are not an indication for continued exclusion.
Conjunctivitis	Exclude until discharge from eyes has ceased.
COVID-19	Your child's safety is our priority. Thomastown West PS has a COVID-Safe Plan. Up-to-date Department of Health instructions will be shared by the school, when needed. Please contact the school if your child has Covid.
Head Lice	Until treated with solution as recommended by the City of Whittlesea, Health Office.
Impetigo	Until sores have fully healed. The child may be allowed to return provided that appropriate treatment is being applied and that sores on exposed surfaces such as scalp, face, hands and legs are properly covered with occlusive dressings.
Measles	For at least seven days from the appearance of the rash or until medical certificate of recovery is produced.
Mumps	Until fully recovered
Ringworm	Until appropriate treatment has commenced and is supported by a medical certificate.
Rubella	Until fully recovered and at least 4 days from the onset of the rash.
Scarlet Fever	Until a medical certificate of recovery is produced.
Viral Hepatitis	Until a medical certificate of recovery is produced, or on subsidence of symptoms but not before seven days after onset of jaundice.
Whooping Cough	For four weeks or until a medical certificate of recovery is produced.
