

From the Principal Team

Highlights of Term 3

What a productive term we've had!

Teaching and Learning

- ✓ Our Writing NAPLAN results were outstanding! 75% of our year 3s achieved an Exceeding or Strong level and our Year 5s excelled, with 84% achieving Exceeding or Strong.
- ✓ We were pleased with our Reading NAPLAN results as 66% of our year 3s and year 5s achieved an Exceeding or Strong level.
- Numeracy school improvement has continued, with consultant Hannah Marino presenting professional learning sessions and modelling lessons in classrooms.
- ✓ Staff have been studying/researching how to cater for diverse learners through 'spotlighting' in Maths lessons in their professional learning communities (PLC) and after school professional learning.
- ✓ Students have embraced the 'spotlight' in Maths lessons and have benefitted from the explicit teaching.
- ✓ 'Play and Grow' sessions have commenced, with our 2025 preps coming in for Friday morning plays, and making friends.

Positive School Community

Attitudes to school student survey results:

- √ 93% of our years 4-6 students were reported to have high
 expectations for success and a positive attitude towards
 attending school.
- √ 85% of our years 4-6 students were reported to have a sense of inclusion at TWPS.
- √ 85% of our years 4-6 students reported that their teacher provides differentiated (catering for individual needs) learning challenge.
- ✓ 100% of our years 4-6 students agreed that we have clear rules for classroom behaviour, and 96% agreed that their teacher always **expects them to do their best**.

✓ Thank you to the 22 parents who supported our school by offering their feedback to support our school improvement.

For this reason, this term, we have introduced our new Attendance Encouragement Awards certificates. Three students from each year level have been selected to achieve this award this term. It is important to continue encouraging and supporting your child to improve their school attendance and efforts. Every step they take toward improvement is a valuable achievement. School Improvement

Our School Improvement Team has begun the process of leading our school through the Pre-Review-Self-Evaluation. This means our leaders, staff and School Council have been busily reading through and updating our school policies, including those related to the Department of Education Child Safe Standards. On Wednesday afternoon, teachers began reflecting on all the successes and goals we have achieved in the last 4 years, since our last review, when analysing our Attitudes to School student survey data. In Term 4, we will host student and parent forums to share our achievement data with the community. Our School Review will be held Term 1, 2025. All schools must participate in a school review every 4 years. We are looking forward to identifying our successes, as well as our opportunities for improvement. The school review also informs the development of the school's 4-year School Strategic Plan.

Enrolling at TWPS for 2025

All Victorian government schools recently received their indicative school resource package (budget) for 2025. It is from this our school will begin organising staffing, class structures, resources and programs for the coming year. The projected school population is what largely determines the amount of funding we receive for any given year, and therefore this determines what staff we are able to employ and what programs we will run. Please inform the Office if you have not yet enrolled your child for Prep 2025 or if you are moving houses or changing schools.

Are you leaving?

It is very important for us to have accurate enrolment numbers for children attending TWPS in 2019. This allows us to achieve the best possible class structures and class sizes can be organised to maximise student engagement, wellbeing and learning.

We understand that some families are moving houses and there may be schools that are closer to your new address. We will support your child and their transition to a new school. Please contact us as soon as possible to let us know if your child/children will not be attending TWPS in 2015.

Emergency contact details

Getting ready for the **School Saving Bonus** and **Term 4** it is timely to think about emergency contact information that is held by the school for your child/children. 

School Saving Bonus

Information for government school parents and carers

About the School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government is making life that little bit easier for families by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like camps, excursions and sports.

The School Saving Bonus is in addition to existing and continuing meanstested supports for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and the Affordable School Uniforms Program.

The School Saving Bonus will be provided to schools and families in Term 4, 2024.

Who receives the School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus is available for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Parents and carers of children who meet the School Saving Bonus eligibility above are required to do the following by **Friday 18 October 2024**:

Complete enrolment

If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025, please complete enrolment. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.

Check your contact information

Ensure your contact information is up to date with your school. You can check this information by contacting your school directly.

Accessing the \$400 School Saving Bonus

You do not need to apply for the School Saving Bonus.

The Department of Education will email you in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to access it via an online system.

You can decide how to best use the School Saving Bonus for your family's needs. You can choose how to allocate the \$400 in the online system.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- · camps, trips, excursions and incursions
- · swimming and sporting programs
- · outdoor education programs
- graduations
- school uniforms
- · textbooks.

The bonus can be used at your school's approved textbook or uniform suppliers either in-store or online, or through State Schools' Relief. The list of suppliers may include a school uniform or bookshop. Any amount that you choose to allocate to textbooks and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities.

Funds will roll over for use in future years if it is not all spent in 2025.

Families with more than one eligible child

Families who have more than one child at the same school can combine their School Saving Bonus payments to use on one child, or for a specific activity. So, for example, a family with 3 children who are all government school students would receive support to the value of \$1,200 and choose how they spend those funds. The School Saving Bonus cannot be combined across different schools.

Thomastown West Primary School is pleased to announce that we are now a SunSmart School.

The SunSmart program is dedicated to reducing skin cancer incidence, illness and mortality through a targeted prevention and early detection program.

The objectives of the SunSmart Program is:

- 1. Improve and monitor skin cancer prevention awareness, knowledge, attitudes and behaviour
- 2. Support priority populations to detect cancers earlier.
- Advocate for strategies that aim to reduce the health and economic burdens of skin cancer.

Thomastown West Primary School recommends that from September 1st to end of April, and whenever UV levels reach 3 and above, students come to school wearing sunprotective clothing such as:

- loose, cool, closely-woven fabric
- shirts with a collar and/or high necklines
- tops with elbow length or long sleeves
- longer style shorts and skirts
- a wide brim hat/ bucket or legionnaire style hat to be worn in September 1st to the end of April.

For the best protection use all five forms of sun protection-clothing, sunscreen, a broad brim hat, shade and sunglasses-when the UV is 3 and above.



What about Before School care?

From Term 4, there will no longer be Before School Care at the Multi-Purpose Room.

Instead, TWPS will offer a FREE Breakfast Club at our Community Hub from 7:45am.

Thomastown West Primary School will return to our traditional TWPS Breakfast Club but with a few necessary changes!

- > Breakfast Club will open at 7:45am.
- > Breakfast Club is FREE.
- Breakfast Club will operate from our Thomastown West Community Hub.
- Students will enter Breakfast Club via the single Hub gate on Main Street.
- > From 7:45am 8:15am parents or carers must drop their child at Breakfast Club and sign them in.
- > From 8:15am students may arrive at Breakfast Club in the Hub and sign in without their parents or carers.
- Students are encouraged to bring a small toy or game to play. There are plenty of books to read at the Hub.
- > The Breakfast Club will close at 8:30am and the single Hub gate on Main Street will be closed.
- > At 8:30am the double gates at the front entrance of our school will be opened for students to enter.

Your co-operation is sought in maintaining a safe and happy school.























It's NOT OK to BE AWAY UNLESS YOU ARE SICK!

Please support our school community by keeping your children at home while they are unwell. The table below indicates the duration of your child's recovery period and the period during which they should refrain from attending school while infectious.

Chicken Pox	Until fully recovered. Please note some remaining scabs are not an indication for continued exclusion.
Conjunctivitis	Exclude until discharge from eyes has ceased.
COVID-19	Your child's safety is our priority. Thomastown West PS has a COVID-Safe Plan. Up-to-date Department of Health instructions will be shared by the school, when needed. Please contact the school if your child has Covid.
Head Lice	Until treated with solution as recommended by the City of Whittlesea, Health Office.
Impetigo	Until sores have fully healed. The child may be allowed to return provided that appropriate treatment is being applied and that sores on exposed surfaces such as scalp, face, hands and legs are properly covered with occlusive dressings.
Measles	For at least seven days from the appearance of the rash or until medical certificate of recovery is produced.
Mumps	Until fully recovered
Ringworm	Until appropriate treatment has commenced and is supported by a medical certificate.
Rubella	Until fully recovered and at least 4 days from the onset of the rash.
Scarlet Fever	Until a medical certificate of recovery is produced.
Viral Hepatitis	Until a medical certificate of recovery is produced, or on subsidence of symptoms but not before seven days after onset of jaundice.
Whooping Cough	For four weeks or until a medical certificate of recovery is produced.


