From the Assistant Principal

We hope you had a lovely break, and for those that celebrate Eid it was a special time, as well as for families who celebrated Easter. My family and I went to Marysville for 3 nights over the Easter long weekend, then spent 3 nights camping at Lake Eildon. It was a lot of fun, and the weather was perfect, except for one night when we were meant to be in our tent but there was 40mm of rain, including thunder and lightning. We booked a cabin in the caravan park that night. It was the correct decision. Term 2 is starting off with an action packed first few weeks. There are excursions, incursions and camps throughout the school in the first 3 weeks back. Mrs Young is back after a week of long service leave in week 1, seeing family up in Sydney.

Grade 3/4 Camp

In week 3, the grade 3/4 students are going on their 2-night camp at Malmsbury. Students are excited and so are the teachers that are going along. Camps are all about building friendships, relationships, resilience and independence. They are so much fun and full of activities and outdoor education experiences that students would never experience anywhere else. We know that some students may have never been away from their family home for this long before, and this is part of the experience also. If your child is going on camp, they are in safe hands and you will be contacted if there are any issues or concerns while the students and teachers are away together.

STEM

We have had the STEM grade 5/6 excursion to the Victorian Space Science Education Centre at Strathmore Secondary College in week 1. Students dressed up as astronauts and explored a replica of the Mars surface, then switched to commanding each other from Earth, giving instructions to the astronauts on Mars. There was also a lab where there was a robotic arm, and students had to experiment with plants and chemicals to see how we could live on Mars and grow food and have clean water. Thank you to Miss Halabi who organised this fun and free excursion for the grade 5/6 classes. It was great to hear how much the students learnt and enjoyed themselves.

There was another incursion in week 2, with the Prep-2 classes visited by Yarra Valley Water, to learn about how we get lovely clean water from our taps, after it is rained down into Melbourne's water storage.

Hats


