Education Week

Celebrating Education Week in 2024 takes place from 13 May to 17 May and schools showcase and celebrate excellence in education through open mornings, and events. Thomastown West Primary School is inviting you to come along on open morning this Thursday 16th May from 9am-10am to observe and acknowledge your child's great work. It does mean a lot to your child, to have you come and see them 'in action' learning at school. Every school changes the lives of its students and has an impact on their future careers. Every Day of Learning Counts

School attendance is important. We all want our students to get a great education . The building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future. A student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school. There is no safe number of days for missing school — each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are things we can do together to ensure they don't fall behind:

- ✓ Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.
- ✓ Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

If your child must miss school or if you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher, Mr Crotti or myself know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

Arriving on time to school is incredibly important! Students who arrive on time will be there for the 'introductions' to the lesson with focused teaching and a learning intention. If a student arrives late, they have

learning intention. If a student arrives late, they have missed an important part of the lesson. This can impact their learning! Please parents, have your children at school on time, ready for their learning. Thank you.

Thomastown West Primary School is a child safe organisation which welcomes all children, young people and their families.

We take proactive steps to identify and manage any risk of harm to students in our school environment. When child safety concerns are raised or identified, we treat these seriously and respond promptly and thoroughly.

Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of all students experiencing risk or vulnerability. Inappropriate or harmful behaviour targeting students based on these or other characteristics, such as racism or homophobia, are not tolerated at our school, and any instances identified will be addressed with appropriate consequences.

Child safety is a shared responsibility. Every person involved in our school has an important role in promoting child safety and wellbeing and promptly raising any issues or concerns about a child's safety.

Thomastown West Primary School has zero tolerance for child abuse.

We are committed to regularly reviewing our child safe practices, and seeking input from our students, families, staff, and volunteers to inform our ongoing strategies.

At Thomastown West Primary School, our approach to creating and maintaining a child safe school environment is also guided by our school values. At Thomastown West Primary School our motto is Together Working on Pathways to Success. At Thomastown West Primary School, we respect ourselves, our school and each another, and understand that our attitudes and behaviours have an impact on the people around us.

Resilient: Resilience is what helps you to cope, get through hard times and recover. Sometimes it makes you even stronger than you were before. It means we bounce back after difficult times.

Responsible: Being responsible means, you do the things you are expected to do and accept the consequences (results) of your actions. It means you do what is right.

Empathetic: Empathy is the ability to understand how someone else is feeling or to understand the situation they are in. It means 'putting yourself in someone else's shoes.'

Respectful: Respect is thinking and acting in a positive way about yourself and others. It means you behave in a way that shows you care about the feelings and wellbeing of other people.

We will **strive to do our best**: Striving to be your best is the ability to keep working towards a goal, overcoming challenges and sticking with it even when it's hard. It means believing in your heart that you can make choices you are proud of, and always trying your best.

In the game "Azul," you get to pick colourful square tiles and try to fill up your board to make a cool design in a 'palace'. You have to think carefully about where to put your tiles because you can get extra points for certain patterns or

filling up areas. (HINT: completing a column scores more points than a horizontal row) If you take too many tiles you can't use, you'll lose points. Whoever has the most points at the end of the game wins and becomes the best palace decorator! Azul is a easier than the next game.






MRS YOUNG'S NEW FAVOURITE (TILE) GAME is "Azul: Summer Pavilion," where you pick up and place different coloured diamond shaped tiles on your board to get points, making it through six rounds. At the start of each round, spaces on the board get filled up with new tiles. You choose tiles from these spaces, grabbing all of one colour and sometimes a special wild tile too. Your board has stars on it, and you want to fill these up with the right number of tiles. Every time you place a tile, you could score points, especially if you put it next to others or complete certain designs. There are extra points if you completely fill up the stars or make cool patterns by the end of the game! In this game, if you have tiles you didn't use, you can save four of them for the next round.



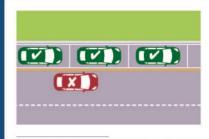

A driver must not stop on the side of the road marked with a yellow edge line.

Fire hydrants



1 Metre clearance is required for fire hydrants, fire hydrant indicators or fire plug indicators.

School crossings



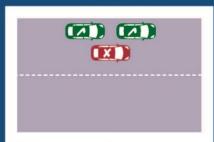
- · Look out for flags and crossing supervisors.
- You must stop for anyone waiting to cross, or who has started crossing
- Please remain stopped until the crossing is clear.

No crossing on nature strips/footpaths



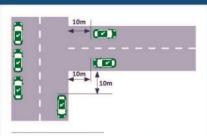
Parking is illegal on nature strips and footpaths.

Double parking



It is illegal to double park at anytime. This affects the fllow of traffic.

Within 10 metres of an intersection



A driver must not stop with any part of their vehicle within 10 metres of an intersection unless signed otherwise.

Stopping across driveways



It is illegal to stop/park across a driveway unless you stay in the car and are there for no more than two minutes and move immediately if required to do so to allow entry or exit by the owner/occupier.

3 Metre gap from white line



At least 3 metres must be left between your vehicle and the centre dividing line to allow other vehicles to pass safely and not obstruct traffic.
