SCHOOL COUNCIL

On Tuesday evening the TWPS School Council had a very productive meeting! The 2024 revised Budget and potential dates for Curriculum Days in 2025 were approved. We also spoke about following up the broken School Crossing and the timetable of a local bus that members of our school community use. During the meetings for the remainder of the year, we will be reviewing our school policies so that we are prepared for our Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA) audit later this year. In last month's School Council meeting (May), the 2023 Annual Report was presented (now available on our school website) and we discussed Child Safe Standards at our school, including our Student Engagement, Wellbeing, Inclusion teaching strategies and the implementation of the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) at TWPS. This also includes The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships learning materials that develop students' social, emotional and positive relationship skills. The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) learning materials cover eight topics of Social and Emotional Learning across all levels of primary and secondary education.

CALM Youth believes purpose and passion go hand in hand. Inspiring purpose through passion (IPTP) is a Wellbeing Program that our Grade 3/4 Boys participated in this term.

IPTP seeks to aid young people in their educational and social transitions.

Our students participated in a self-determined personal development journey through a creative project-based model.

Our students completed a 5 week "self-discovery" portfolio centred around their passions and interests which can be used to be applied on a broader spectrum in everyday life and their many transitions they will experience. The portfolio will be a collection of each week's activities and will allow students to understand who they are, what they like, what they aren't great at, and ultimately where do they want to be.

students to our school values, rights and responsibilities. You would have seen your child's classroom agreement in Term 1.

- ✓ Every Thursday from 2:15-3:15pm our entire school participates in a *Student Engagement, Wellbeing and Inclusion hour* where students learn more about our school values, School Wide Positive Behaviour and RRRR. Every third Thursday, our Buddy Classes get together to continue their wellbeing learning together!
- ✓ Every day students participate in a Morning Circle and mindfulness sessions.
- ✓ All students have a Getting Ready to Learn Plan.

Consent Education in Schools was also raised in the May School Council meeting. Mr Crotti and I thought the following information would be useful to share in the newsletter: The teaching of consent is mandatory in all Victorian government schools. The Consent Education Guidance supports schools to teach students about consent in an age appropriate way from Foundation to Year 12. As with all areas of the curriculum, teachers use their professional judgement to determine the appropriateness of any given resource in terms of being age appropriate and suitable for the needs of the students they teach. The Guidance from the Department of Education provides an outline of available resources and supports for teaching consent at all levels. Teachers send home information/permission notices to receive consent from parents/carers as needed.

For example, as part of the Grade 5/6 Health Curriculum, TWPS is providing an opportunity for all students to undertake a unit of study about the *physical, social and emotional changes experienced by children as they grow from childhood to adulthood.* Respectful relationships and gender equality will be re-enforced throughout the program. This program will be presented by professional and experienced educators from SEA Living & Growing Education, running over three weeks, one-hour sessions. Permission notices will be sent home.

Thomastown West Community Hub Update

Our school's Hub has successfully operated for 10 years through the support of a very generous philanthropic family who reached out to support our school via The Smith Family and the tremendous support from Whittlesea Connections. Sadly, the funding has been paused, which means there will be no Hub programs running in term 3. However, TWPS is seeking sponsorship to continue our Chess Club in Term 3 and

Prep Survey

In the first week of Term 3 our Prep students along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which

provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.



The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years. Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need. Please contact Mrs Young if you have any questions or concerns.

School Uniform

It is official school policy endorsed by our School Council that the wearing of school uniform be <u>compulsory</u> for all our students. We understand that winter is here and it's COLD, but there are quite a number of students who are wearing black or grey hooded jumpers underneath their red polo shirt but NOT their bomber jacket. Of course, students can wear a different coloured thick jacket in the mornings or outside <u>over</u> their uniform jumper or uniform bomber jacket to stay warm. Students are encouraged to take off their thick jackets and beanies when they enter their classrooms as they are heated. Please remember that NAVY BLUE and RED are our school colours NOT black and NOT grey!

Did you know... Often when the children do not wear their uniform they tell us "It's in the wash!" If this is the case, could you please write a note to inform your child's classroom teacher. © Thank you! If you need to purchase uniform supplies, the 'School Uniform' shop, is located at Thomastown Secondary College and is open for sales every Second Tuesday afternoon between 2.00pm and 3.00pm.

Need Help with school uniform? We encourage you to speak to your classroom teacher, Mrs Irons, the Office staff, Mr Crotti or Mrs Young if you would like some support. Uniform Shop vouchers can be accessed through State Schools Relief for those families who qualify.

Arrive on time, at quarter to nine!

Congratulations to all of the fabulous students who arrive on time, READY TO LEARN, at quarter to nine EVERY DAY! **PLEASE NOTE:** From Term 3, to avoid unnecessary distractions during crucial learning time at the start of the school day, **students will say goodbye to their parents/carers in the foyer** and staff will aid the children to get to class safely. There will be no need for parents to escort their child to class after 8:50am.

Maths Olympiad Update

Thomastown West Primary School's Maths Olympiad team has shown great progress and dedication this year. The team, composed of students from years 5 and 6 have been working hard through challenging math problems since the middle of term 1. The team members have honed their problem-solving skills, developed strategic thinking, and fostered a collaborative spirit that has significantly contributed to their success.

In the initial stages of the competition, the team faced challenges as they adapted to the rigorous demands of the Olympiad. Their first test results reflected a steep learning curve. However, the students demonstrated resilience and a growth mindset, embracing feedback and diligently working on their problem-solving skills to tackle these difficult challenges. 

It's NOT OK to BE AWAY UNLESS YOU ARE SICK!

Please support our school community by keeping your children at home while they are unwell. The table below indicates the duration of your child's recovery period and the period during which they should refrain from attending school while infectious.

Chicken Pox	Until fully recovered. Please note some remaining scabs are not an indication for continued exclusion.
Conjunctivitis	Exclude until discharge from eyes has ceased.
COVID-19	Your child's safety is our priority. Thomastown West PS has a COVID-Safe Plan. Up-to-date Department of Health instructions will be shared by the school, when needed. Please contact the school if your child has Covid.
Head Lice	Until treated with solution as recommended by the City of Whittlesea, Health Office.
Impetigo	Until sores have fully healed. The child may be allowed to return provided that appropriate treatment is being applied and that sores on exposed surfaces such as scalp, face, hands and legs are properly covered with occlusive dressings.
Measles	For at least seven days from the appearance of the rash or until medical certificate of recovery is produced.
Mumps	Until fully recovered
Ringworm	Until appropriate treatment has commenced and is supported by a medical certificate.
Rubella	Until fully recovered and at least 4 days from the onset of the rash.
Scarlet Fever	Until a medical certificate of recovery is produced.
Viral Hepatitis	Until a medical certificate of recovery is produced, or on subsidence of symptoms but not before seven days after onset of jaundice.
Whooping Cough	For four weeks or until a medical certificate of recovery is produced.
























Parent Code of Conduct at Thomastown West PS


